

1) Can we get a general description (or photo) of the camp site area?

The camp site is a large expanse of lawn at the North end of the island. Near the camp site is the beach house which has restrooms, dining area, and a kitchen.

2) Confirming that campers can use the stove, sink, bathrooms and showers?

The beach house has bathrooms, kitchen with sink, oven, range, and microwave, and two refrigerators with freezers. There is also an outdoor shower if needed, but is only rarely used by overnight groups. All water in sinks and showers is potable and safe to drink.

3) Can we get a general timeline of the activities?

Please see attached schedules of overnight activities. One schedule is of the regular Scientific Overnight Program, the other is of the Oceanography Merit Badge Overnight. The attached schedules are for Saturday-Sunday overnights. Friday-Saturday overnights are very similar, with start and end times pushed back one hour and with slight changes to tour times.

4) For the boat ride, are we limited to what we can bring to the island? Heavy backpacks with camping equipment okay?

We encourage participants to bring only what they need for the overnight. Unnecessary heavy/bulky items include lawn chairs, shade/pop-up tents, grills, and fire pits (there are no open fires or grilling permitted during the overnight).

5) Confirming there is no dinner break and we are to eat before we board the boat or after the activities?

A dinner break is included in both overnight programs. It is important that the group stays together and on time, so we ask that you bring a sack dinner, or one that is easily and quickly reheated using the microwave, oven, or range. We provide a light snack before bed and a continental breakfast in the morning consisting of fruit, bagels, and pastries.

1) Out of the 36 participants, we need to be at least 4 adults. (10 to 1 ratio, minors to adults)

2) There is a \$40 fee per person (youth and adult) which covers the boat ride to and from, the merit badge activities/supplies, an evening snack, a continental breakfast, and the use of their pavilion facilities, which includes a bathroom and a beach shower. Dinner should either be eaten before 4pm or participants are advised to bring a sack dinner. If this is humbug, for an additional \$10 per person, we can order a pizza dinner through them (UH) and they will get it to the island.

3) The program runs from 4pm on Saturday til 9am on Sunday. Not sure what time we need to be at the dock on Saturday to load up. The boat is super small and will take many trips to get everyone back and forth.
